Dear Members and Friends of PCMP,

We have journeyed through Lent walking with Jesus toward the cross. Now we pray and wait for Easter and God's surprise of an empty tomb and new life.

In the process we've been reminded that God's love will go to any length, even the grave, to express its character, and nothing can defeat it in life or in death. So how do we, the Church, express that love? How do we live out that good news of God's love in Jesus Christ? For we are called to live out that love, live out our faith, even more than we are asked to understand it.

Such faith permeates our whole being with its power and truth if we allow ourselves to stay open to it and work at it, especially in community.

I am delighted to have entered into a covenant of interim ministry with your community of faith. This time of transition between permanent, installed pastorates can be a hope filled bridge to cross between past and future for a congregation. It is a period of opportunity and renewal, of reflection and growth, of building and dreaming even in the midst of change, of healing wounds, and dealing with a mix of feelings including loss.

While an interim minister is a temporary pastoral position for a limited amount of time, there is nothing half-hearted, incomplete, or less than about the sustained, pastoral leadership and ministry I bring to my relationship and time with you. My covenant with you in this time and place is to be your pastor: preaching, teaching, celebrating the Sacraments, moderating Session meetings, attending Committee meetings, listening, sharing your lives, walking with and being present with you, as you deepen your relationship with God and each other.

I will also be doing the work of interim ministry, being with this congregation to facilitate and guide your community as we intentionally move through this transition, looking into your heritage and history, current context, ways you carry out PCMP's ministry and mission, and your connections to the larger church. Fundamentally, interim ministry allows the community to use the gifts of time and process to view themselves and remember who they are, while imagining the future, discovering who God is calling them to be and committing to new directions in the days ahead.

What a privilege and joy! I am blessed to share this time with you as your Interim Pastor.





1st SUNDAY FOOD DRIVE

On **April 1st** we will commune with our Lord as we celebrate communion. We'll have just a little bit of bread and a tiny bit of the cup, but in that taste we will experience the real presence of Christ with us. Throughout his life, Jesus acted always for the benefit of those who were in need and on the margins. When we are fed by the Lord's Supper, not only is our spirituality nourished (our sense of connection with God), but so is our faith (our beliefs and actions that result from that connection). As a symbol of our deep connection with Christ and a sign that we are his hands and hearts at work in the world, we will bring a non-perishable food item to worship on the days we celebrate communion. They can be left in the back of the sanctuary with the ushers or brought forward and placed under the communion table. As God feeds us, we feed our neighbors.

The most needed foods are: dry milk, Parmalat, evaporated milk, calcium fortified milk alternatives (soy, rice, almond milk), soups, pasta, canned fruit, canned beans, tuna fish, Rice-a-Roni, Hamburger & Tuna Helper, Boost, Ensure, Glucerna, Enfamil, baby food, baby wipes.
