Friends, this is a very good photograph of someone who was instrumental in my entering ministry. Her name is Alison Adam. I have known Alison since I was in my own church youth group. She used to come each year as a Presbytery Youth Volunteer and get our Youth Group singing songs from all around the world in four-part harmony.

Alison and I deepened our connection when I became heavily involved in church based Youth Work and she was appointed the Youth Worker for the Iona Community. However, as this photograph shows – Alison's amazing gift is getting congregations to enjoy singing praises to God.

She has spent over twenty years working in this area as part of the Wild Goose Resource Group alongside Rev. John L. Bell (whose hymns we often sing in the new hymnal) and for the last ten years or so, on her own as a consultant throughout the UK and abroad.

Alison is coming to our church at the end of August (weekend of 25-27). She is coming to teach us some songs from our new Hymnal 'Glory to God'. On Friday 25 August, at 7.30 p.m. she will be leading what she calls a 'Big Sing!' In that time, we will be joined by members of other churches in Presbytery, and Alison will lead us in a variety of songs that exist within the new book.

On the Saturday following, at 10.30 a.m. she will be leading another workshop on how to introduce new music to congregations. Finally, she will be responsible for shaping worship with me for Sunday 27 August 2017. It will be a great event that I know our own Skip Yingling has organized time from his current post to attend.

Now, I know immediately there will be some who think that they cannot sing and that this event is not for them. Well, having heard our male and female choir on both 'Mother's' and 'Father's' days I know that there are lot better singers in our midst than many might credit themselves with. Alison has amazing energy to take that good sound and use it beautifully for God's purposes. Spending time listening to her teaching and fun is something that I know, because I have seen it so many times, that anyone who thinks that they cannot sing will find themselves part of a heavenly chorus.

So, don't rule yourself out! Come along and find that voice that you never knew you had. I promise you a lot of fun and energy.

**Summer Sermon Series****1st SUNDAY FOOD DRIVE**

On July 2<sup>nd</sup> and August 6<sup>th</sup> we will commune with our Lord as we celebrate communion. We'll have just a little bit of bread and a tiny bit of the cup, but in that taste we will experience the real presence of Christ with us. Throughout his life, Jesus acted always for the benefit of those who were in need and on the margins. When we are fed by the Lord's Supper, not only is our spirituality nourished (our sense of connection with God), but so is our faith (our beliefs and actions that result from that connection). As a symbol of our deep connection with Christ and a sign that we are his hands and hearts at work in the world, we will bring a non-perishable food item to worship on the days we celebrate communion. They can be left in the back of the sanctuary with the ushers or brought forward and placed under the communion table. As God feeds us, we feed our neighbors.



The most needed foods are: dry milk, Parmalat, evaporated milk, calcium fortified milk alternatives (soy, rice, almond milk), soups, pasta, canned fruit, canned beans, tuna fish, Rice-a-Roni, Hamburger & Tuna Helper, Boost, Ensure, Glucerna, Enfamil, baby food, baby wipes.
